Medication is to be kept with staff throughout the day to ensure prompt access when in different areas of the venue. Parents to be reminded that the Centre is 'Nut Aware' and nuts are not permitted at the service. Supervised eating times ensures that educators are observing if any of the children are eating nuts. 
